





















## CHALLENGES AND LESSONS LEARNT.

As a young organization, we have inadequate resources since we have no funding for mass mental health awareness campaigns, the target groups could not be adequately reached as desired. We have learnt that the only way out is through partnerships. We were able to partner and in some cases volunteer to work with other organizations so as to reach the desired group of people.

West Nile is a wide region 12 political districts and Arua city making it 13. Lack of transport means (motorcycles and vehicles) makes movement hard since public transport is costly to traverse the area. Through friendships and partnerships, we have been able to move to some of the areas though at the mercy of the other partners. Meaning we have to wait for them when they are moving in that direction or when they are free so we can borrow their motorcycles or vehicles to use. It's an inconvenience though. Many times I have reached out to friends to help us reach out in terms of transport. Some have really helped us though for others it's been an inconvenience.



Few volunteers since our work is on voluntary basis. In most cases we only engage some of them when there are available funds to offer services of their expertize.
